

Tellus Survey

Background

Tellus is a national survey which gathers the views of children and young people in years 6, 8 and 10, on their life, their school and their local area. Findings from the survey are used to inform policy development and to measure progress and performance, at a local and national level, across the five Every Child Matters (ECM) outcomes.

The survey was originally developed by Ofsted as an online survey in 2007 (Tellus2) and run again in 2008 (Tellus3). The Department for Children, Schools and Families is now responsible for the survey and has commissioned the National Foundation for Educational Research (NFER) to further develop and deliver Tellus4 in autumn 2009.

Tellus4 Standard Report

The outcomes of the Tellus4 survey have recently been published and the Local Authority's Standard Report is attached as Appendix 1.

The report provides the results from children and young people in the sample to each of the core questions in the Tellus4 survey. The total number of children and young people included in the survey results is provided at the beginning of the report (the total figure will represent the final figure after data cleaning so some responses may have been deleted in this process).

As well as the results for Wolverhampton the following comparisons are provided

- **National data** – this includes all 253,755 children in Year 6, 8 and 10 who responded across 151 English Local Authorities.
- **Statistical neighbours¹** – this includes the responses for Wolverhampton's statistical neighbours.
- **Contextually adjusted** – this presents the figures for Wolverhampton after they have been adjusted by weighting so that the background characteristics of the Local Authority (based on responses to the 'About You' section in the survey) more closely match those of children and young people nationally. This therefore reflects what the responses would look like if Wolverhampton was the same as a 'typical Local Authority' in England.

The shading denotes statistically significant differences (at the 5% level) between the responses in Wolverhampton and the comparison groups. This means that, whatever the percentage difference between the two figures, it is statistically significant and therefore maybe worthy of note. The red, green and grey shading has been assigned as follows;

National data comparisons – shaded in 'your LA' column

- **Red** = significantly **less** positive than the national findings
- **Green** = significantly **more** positive than the national findings
- **Grey** = significant difference but not a question where 'more or less positive' is appropriate

Statistical neighbour comparisons – shaded in 'statistical neighbour' column

- **Red** = **your LA** is significantly **less** positive than your statistical neighbours
- **Green** = **your LA** is significantly **more** positive than your statistical neighbours
- **Grey** = significant difference but not a question where 'more or less positive' is appropriate

Contextually adjusted figures – shaded in 'contextually adjusted figures' column

- **Red** = **your LA** is significantly **less** positive than the national findings once Wolverhampton's context is taken in to account statistically
- **Green** = **your LA** is significantly **more** positive than the national figures once Wolverhampton's context is taken in to account statistically
- **Grey** = significant difference but not a question where 'more or less positive' is appropriate

A higher or lower percentage in the Local Authority than in the comparison groups can be a positive outcome, depending on the nature of the question. So for each question, the Tellus team have identified whether a result that is higher than the national figure is a positive (so coloured green) or less positive (so coloured red) result. For example, if the Local Authority has a higher percentage of children and young people who said that they had experienced bullying than is the case nationally, this is coloured red. However, if the Local Authority has a higher percentage who said that the parks and play areas are good, this is coloured green.

Local Authority National Indicator Analysis Report

The survey provides the source of data to inform the following five DCSF indicators in the National Indicator Set and three DCSF-led Public Service Agreements (PSAs)

- NI 50: Emotional health (PSA 12 Improves child health and well-being)
- NI 69: Bullying (PSA13 Improve child safety)
- NI 110 : Positive activities & NI 115: Substance misuse (PSA 14 Young people on the path to success)
- NI 199: Parks and play areas.

Wolverhampton's National Indicator Report is provided as Appendix 2.

Tellus5

As with Tellus4, for Tellus5, NFER (on behalf of the DCSF) will continue to:

- administer the survey to schools in the autumn term 2010
- give schools the opportunity to enter their whole year group in years 6, 8 and 10
- provide Local Authorities and schools the option to personalise the survey by selecting additional questions from a Question bank from May 2010 onwards
- provide feedback to all Local Authorities through the standard reports and online tool and for schools via the online tool.

The timetable of key activities for Tellus5:

- By 28th April 2010 - Confirm sample size with Local Authorities
- Early May 2010 - Confirm list of sampled schools for Tellus5 with Local Authorities
- Mid-May 2010 - Invite schools to participate in the survey
- May/June 2010 – Local Authorities personalise their survey by selecting additional questions from the Question bank
- June/July 2010 - Schools personalise their survey by selecting additional questions from the Question bank
- 4 October 2010-12 November 2010 - Survey Live Period
- February/March 2011 - Feedback and survey results.

In order to ensure that the data gathered through Tellus5 is robust and representative of the views of young people in years 6, 8 and 10 nationally, as well as at Local Authority level, the NFER will be selecting a representative sample of schools in Wolverhampton. It is proposed to include the following in the sample for all Local Authorities as standard:

- All secondary schools (including Academies)
- 4 special schools
- 60 primary schools
- 2 PRUs

Recommendations

The Board note the findings of the Tellus4 Survey and agree to them being shared with all schools via Engage.

The Board register the DCSF's intention to commission the NFER to undertake the Tellus5 Survey in 2010.

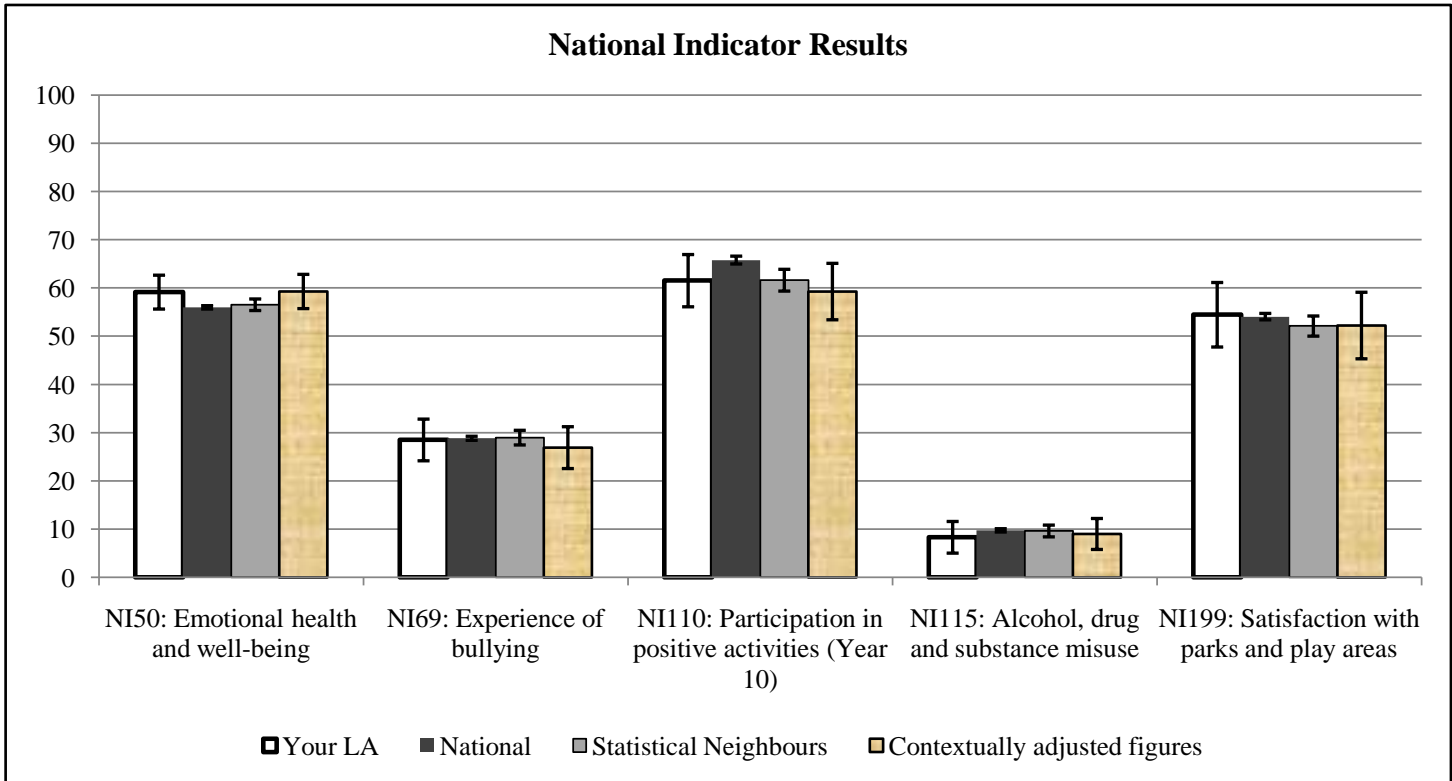
